General Range Rules

All users shall honor the following range guidelines:

- All firearms (including holstered carried firearms) transported into the indoor range shall be unloaded, in a carrying container (shooting box, rugs, etc.) or actions open. Muzzle always pointed in a safe direction.
- Before entering the range area, wait for cease firing. Donning proper eye and ear protection, open door slowly and wait for approval (if range is in use) to proceed to the range line to set equipment on the benches. When safe to do so, place firearms on the bench in a safe condition. Start air cleaner.
- No loaded firearms before range command to load.
- Before advancing forward to the targets the line will be made safe.
- Line safe is cylinders open, slides back, magazines out, muzzles pointed down range, guns on the table.
- While line is safe, no guns are to be touched.
- For courtesy, make sure all shooters and spectators have approved hearing and sight protection in place and are ready prior to your shooting.
- Firing distance will not exceed 50 feet.
- Only approved paper targets must be used
- Paper targets must be placed as such that the bullet path is in the center of the target backer.
- The duel timer (3 seconds) is for one shot.
- Anyone on the range may and will call a cease-fire if they see an unsafe situation.
- When a cease-fire is called, shooters will immediately cease-fire, unload firearms, place them on the table, and step back from the shooting line.
- Each time the indoor range is used, inspect for water leaks, broken parts, open or unlocked doors, lights on, furnace function or any other out of the ordinary conditions.

- Each time the indoor range is used, a fee will be paid per shooter, and marked in the log book with the date, name, and amount.
- Each time the indoor range is used, if necessary, any and all problems or concerns will be marked in the log book with date, name, and problem.
- After using the indoor range, set the thermostat down, turn off the target timer, restart the air cleaner, turn off all the lights, lock the front door, and secure the building.
- Indoor range targets in the top open slots of the cabinet are for general use, however the targets behind the doors of the cabinet are for league shooters only.
- Only approved indoor range ammo will be used. Indoor range is low velocity, 1000 fps, lead only bullets. Any questions about ammo contact an officer of the club.
- Indoor range users will maintain good firearm and range safety rules. Any questions about firearm and safety rules contact an officer of the club.
- Make certain that the door to the range is locked while you are using the range and when you leave.
- Clean up all brass, targets, ammo boxes etc., sweep if necessary
- No food or drink is allowed in the range.

Ammunition Regulations

- Smokeless ammo only
- Jacketed bullets are prohibited
- Ammo velocity limited to 1000 fps or less.
- At the 50 foot line .45 calibers or less.
- Less then the 50 foot line .45 calibers or less, shooter is responsible for shooting at less than 50 feet.
- Air equipment in 10 meters restricted to pellets/BB's
- Any 22 rim fire ammo except magnum

Allowable firearms

- Any handgun or rifle chambered for approved center fire handgun ammo or rim fire
- No center fire handgun caliber rifle at less than 50 feet
- Orientation and qualification will be a minimum of 10 out of 10 shots on a 14 inch square target at a distance of 50 feet with any approved caliber pistol or pistol caliber rifle. Applicant will indicate which range use pistol or rifle or both. If both, only qualify with pistol. Demonstrate knowledge of firearm safety.
- Check to make sure that range is available when you desire to use it. Leagues, 4-H programs, NRA pistol competition, etc., have preference.
- Actions performed in violation of the above rules, that are assessed to be willful, or a danger to members or property will be cause to review the continued membership of the member in violation.
